Message from CCFI'S Executive Director

This past Flag Day, we reflected on what makes Canada strong—our values, our resilience, and the systems that sustain us. One of those critical systems is Canada's food system, but its strength depends on more than just the work happening within it. It depends on whether Canadians recognize it, understand it, and stand behind it.



We've seen this before. In times of crisis—whether during the pandemic or amid supply chain disruptions—Canada's food system has been recognized as essential, resilient, and world-class. But that recognition has often faded, replaced by indifference rather than engagement. If we want long-term public trust, we can't let this be another fleeting moment. We need to make it a movement.

Right now, as trade tensions with the U.S. spark are renewing a pro-

Canada sentiment, we have an opportunity to ensure that Canada's food system is part of that national conversation. But this won't happen on its own. We need to socialize our food system with Canadians, bring it into their everyday conversations, and make them care about it—not just when challenges arise, but always.

That's why the Public Awareness Initiative is focused on making sure that Canada's food system has a stronger, more visible voice. This isn't just about telling a story; it's about ensuring that our sector is at the table when policies are shaped, when public conversations happen, and when trust is built.

But to do that, we need to work together. We need leaders across the food system—across all sectors and industries—to join in, to align efforts, and to push this forward as a collective priority.

If we do this right, Canada's food system won't just be something Canadians trust. It will be something they champion.

Let's make it happen.
